

# Plane Crash Fatal To Chicago Airman

**Robert Cullen Grant Dies of Injuries at St. Joseph Hospital; Condition of Wilson Rogers Still Regarded as Serious.**

Robert Cullen Grant, Jr., 22, of Chicago, injured in a plane crash near Burnettsville Thursday afternoon, died at 6:10 p. m. yesterday in St. Joseph hospital.

His companion, Wilson Rogers, 22, also of Chicago, was reported to be still in a serious condition but holding his own at the hospital.

The two youths were flying here to visit Rogers' father, Anthony, who is employed at the Jack Hawkins Stock Sales company when their two-seater Taylorcraft plane crashed into a corn field four miles north of Burnettsville.

It still has not been established definitely which of the youths was piloting the plane but one of the rescuers said that Rogers was sitting in the pilot's seat when the plane was reached.

Cause of the crash also was still doubtful but it is believed the flyers were trying to find a landmark and lost too much altitude. An official of the CACA, after inspecting the wreckage yesterday, advanced the theory that the crash

## Temperature Drops to 48

A drop of more than forty degrees in the temperature in Logansport Friday night brought a sudden end to the heat wave which had sent the mercury above the 90 degree mark for the second consecutive day Friday.

Coats reappeared on local streets Saturday morning as the temperature struggled slowly upward in the fifties after dropping to a low mark of 48 degrees at 2 a. m. and staying there for several hours.

Friday's high mark of 91 degrees was reached between 4 and 5 o'clock in the afternoon. The Pharos-Tribune's recording thermometer showed that the sharp drop in the temperature began at 5:30 o'clock, going steadily downward, from 88 degrees at that time to 48 degrees at 2 a. m. when it leveled off. By noon Saturday it had climbed back to 60 degrees.
